Thank you for your interest in the Summerbridge Hong Kong 2021 Summer Program!

- All applicants must submit a completed application form via email, fax, or post. If you are a Hong Kong resident, please submit your application by **FEBRUARY 26, 2021.** If you are not a Hong Kong resident, please submit your application by FEBRUARY 19, 2021. Deadlines vary due to the time needed to obtain a work visa for non-Hong Kong residents. All non-Hong Kong residents must hold a valid passport that remains valid 6 months from the start of the 2021 Summer Program. In order to facilitate visa applications, we strongly encourage passports to be obtained by March 2021.
- Applications are considered on a rolling basis; we strongly encourage you to submit your application earlier.
- Summerbridge sites in Hong Kong have yet to be confirmed. We will let you know the locations in June 2021.



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

Designing Your Course

In this part of the application, you will describe the course that you may teach this summer. Please consider the following when designing your course.

- You will teach your course to classes of eight to ten students (ages 13 to 15) for five weeks.
- Your students are English language learners, with varying levels and abilities. They also have had little opportunity to practice speaking English.
- Summerbridge helps students learn English and build their confidence in speaking English. Therefore, you and your students must speak in English at all times. Your class must be taught entirely in English and you cannot speak or write in Chinese, even if they do not understand a word, definition, or concept. You will need to think of creative and alternative ways to explain things.
- You should choose a subject that you enjoy and feel comfortable teaching. The subject should promote interactive activities, hands-on projects, and English language development. It can be a subject you learned in school or elsewhere. Remember, you only have five weeks, so consider a specific subject. Also, think about the relevance of your subject to students in Hong Kong.
- Here are some examples of past courses: Journalism, Entrepreneurship, Aviation, Drama, Comic Book Making, World Cultures, Astronomy, City Building, Economics, and Debate.



Teaching Presentation Section

(For Local Applicants Only)

Now that you've successfully completed the application, you can now begin preparing for the teaching presentation. You do not need to submit the teaching presentation section with the application, but you will have to bring it along with you to the teaching presentation. This is extremely important, as your application will not be considered without this section. The lesson you propose to teach in this section must be what you teach at the teaching presentation. Please read the following information to help you prepare for the presentation.

For applicants living abroad: You will not do a teaching presentation. We will conduct an online interview. You do not need to fill out this Teaching Presentation Section.

Information on the Teaching Presentation

- The interview should take around 30 minutes. You should prepare a 10-minute teaching presentation, which you will teach during the interview. We will stop you after 10 minutes, and the interview will continue with a 20-minute discussion about your presentation and your interest in joining Summerbridge.
- The lesson plan you develop and teach for the teaching presentation should center around a concept or vocabulary word(s) from the subject that you intend to teach. We want to see a class that addresses the goals of your course and not one filled with icebreaker games. We highly encourage you to use hands-on and interactive activities that would help an English language learner pick up the concept and/or vocabulary word(s) that you're trying to teach.
- The Summerbridge interviewers will be playing the part of Form 2 and 3 (Grade 8/9) Summerbridge student and will act and speak like shy English language learners.
- We will have a whiteboard and a laptop available. If you need anything else, please contact us at least a day beforehand at info@summerbridge.org.hk.

Tips to Prepare for the Presentation

- To gain a better understanding of our students and what it is like to teach in our program, explore the Summerbridge website summerbridge.org.hk
- To prepare for the discussion, think about the strengths and weaknesses of your lesson plan, why you want to join Summerbridge, and why you are interested in teaching.
- We are not looking for perfect teachers! Think of the presentation as a chance for you to practice teaching and learn how to do it better. We are looking for applicants who try different and creative ways of engaging our students and making their class interesting. Think about a class, a lesson, or a teacher you enjoyed and use some of those techniques in your lesson.
